Language—The words we use are important! So often we go into "autopilot" during worship and we miss the meaning of the words we say each Sunday. In an effort to be more conscious of the language we use during worship, some words in our liturgy will change monthly; but please know that you may pray in whatever way you feel comfortable. We are family here!

Coming Up in the Life of the Church

Looking ahead.....for our Easter services, we will be collecting new t-shirts and athletic shorts (for men, women, and children—all sizes) for the Family Protection Center in Morgan County. The center handles sexual assault cases for adults and children—from initial intake and forensic exams/interviews all the way through assistance with the judicial process. These donations will be given to men, women, and children following forensic examinations.

Opportunities for Outreach and Mission

Ministry Bags for March: We will be collecting items for Pup Packs. Pup Packs began as a ministry of the Episcopal Church of the Advent in 2009. In an effort to combat childhood hunger and improve school performance, this ministry provides supplemental food over the weekends for children who might not have the food they need at home. For over 50% of the children in Morgan County Primary and Elementary Schools, school meals may be the only food they have. Pup Packs is run entirely by volunteers and has no overhead other than the cost of food. Donations of money and food enable the program to run. Volunteers shop for the food and then groups of volunteers meet on Fridays to pack the bags and deliver them to the primary and elementary schools. Once delivered, school counselors discreetly distribute them to the children who have been identified as needing the extra help provided by Pup Packs. Siblings who do not attend the elementary or primary schools are included and so many of the participants carry home two or more bags each weekend. Currently and overage of 160 children are served each week. Please choose from the following list to put in your Ministry Bag: pop-top chicken noodle soup or ravioli, instant oatmeal packs, small boxes of raisins, small containers of applesauce, cereal bars or peanut butter crackers.

Our Outreach Ministry is providing opportunities throughout the year to serve with nonprofit organizations in our community. For the month of March, they are spotlighting Habitat for Humanity. Our church has a long history with Habitat for Humanity. When Habitat for Humanity of Morgan County was first organized, founding board members and the Lead Builder were from Madison Presbyterian. Today, Habitat's Board includes four church members and our Lead Builder is Hiram Johnston. Our MPC Outreach budget includes supporting Habitat for Humanity financially. On any given Saturday morning, you will find five or six church members volunteering on the Habitat build site. Habitat's mission: Seeking to put God's love into action, bringing people together to build homes, communities and hope. Home ownership starts with applicants qualifying for a loan. Once approves, the selected home owner, along with friends and family, are required to put in at least 200 hours of sweat equity building. Then, the family moves into the home, leasing from Habitat for six months. Finally, the home owner meets with a closing attorney to close on their home, becoming a proud homeowner with a mortgage. Our church family (16 years and older) are invited to participate in our current home build at 1190 Wheat Street in Madison. We are in the final weeks of this build and anticipate volunteers will be painting and landscaping. We'd love to have a big group representing Madison Presbyterian and supporting this ministry. One Great Hour of Sharing We will receive the One Great Hour of Sharing offering beginning today and continue through the end of March.
